AIA NEWSLETTER HISTORY

AIA's newsletter started in the early 1970's. It was called ("**The Journal**"). It ceased publication around 1978. It was revived in 1994 with Dr. Vinod Bansal in Chicago as editor and renamed ("**BETWEEN US**"). We are now resuming publication of AIA's Newsletter after more than 20 years, keeping the same name ("**BETWEEN US**") which means communication between member.

HISTORY OF AIA

The Association of Indians in America is the oldest National Association of Asian Indians in America. It was founded on August 20, 1967. AIA is the grassroot National Organization of Asian Immigrants in the United States, fostered on the democratic principles of "one member one vote", with chapters and membership spread across the United States of America. AIA represents the hopes and aspirations of those immigrants who are united by their common bond of
"Indian Heritage and American Commitment".

HIGHLIGHTS OF AIA ACHIEVEMENTS

1. Minority Status to Asian Indian Immigrants in 1970's
2. Separate Enumeration of Asian Indians for the first time in US censuses an independent category in 1980
3. Representation before Congressional committees to testify for family reunification provision in the immigration bill.

5. "Project India" an ongoing project of AIA, has channeled Medical Equipment and Funds for Projects and HIV relief work in India.
6. Sushruta and charka Award – Instituted in 1993 to recognize and honor people of Indian origin in the field of Medicine and Health care.
7. Deepavali celebration for public: New York City: at South Street Seaport an ongoing event, since 1987, enjoyed by close to More than 100,000 people in tri state residents.
8. **Publication of "Ananya"**: A Portrait of India: in 1997 in collaboration with India Study Center of Stony Brook University, New York. A highly acclaimed 968-page book on Indian Civilization. Was released at the 50th anniversary of India's independence at a Banquet in Waldorf Astoria
9. Celebration of Diwali at the White house in 2003.
10. Recognition of Diwali by City Council in 2004 and suspension of alternate street parking in all the 5 borrows of NYC in 2005 onwards .
11. Official USPS Deepavali Stamp Unveiled In 2013 Resolution introduced in the House of Representatives advising USPS to issue a stamp commemorating Deepavali which lead to the final issuance of Deepavali stamp in OCT 20th 2016.
12. AIA celebrated Golden Anniversary on DEC 1st 2018.
13. Money raised and sent for construction of schools of India. Also sent Oxygen concentrators and Ventilators and PPE during Covid 19, donated \$ 26,000.00 to PM fund and Grocery kits to needy people.
14. On May 6th 2023, AIA celebrated 75th anniversary of India's Independence at an Honor Banquet at Terrace on the Park in Flushing Meadow, New York attended by dignitaries like Senate Majority Leader Chuck Schumer and NYC Mayor Eric Adams.
15. **Diwali is now declared as a public school Holiday in New York City Public Schools as well as a State Holiday** with the help from Assemblywoman Jennifer Rajkumar, Mayor Eric Adams and Others.

The AIA would work as a unified team to pursue the organization's motto of "Indian Heritage and American Commitment," Munjal said.

"We are here to serve the community needs. As we continue to direct our help to the people in India, our homeland, we should equally remain committed to the community right here in the United States, our adopted country. We hope to work towards increasing that commitment," Munjal said.

Today it takes almost 15 to 20 years for an Indian citizen to get a green card, whereas some other nationalities get a green card in 1 year. We all are planning to go to Washington DC sometime in the end of April 2024 to meet the congressional leaders requesting them to support this bill," Munjal said.

All AIA leadership extended their good wishes and support. The program concluded with a traditional vote of thanks by the secretary.

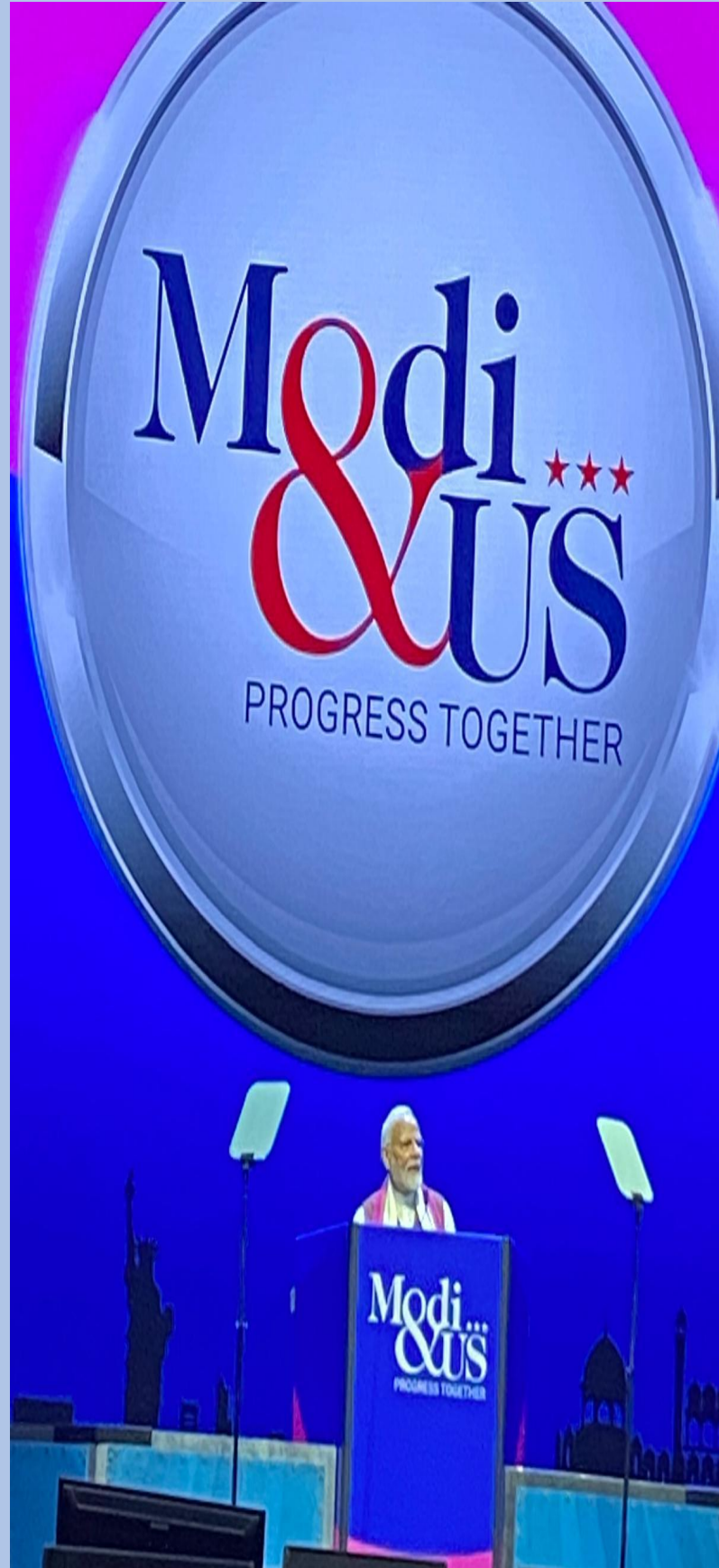

MINNESOTA (TIP): High school student volunteers joined the League of Women Voters of Edina (LWVE) and community workers to educate and register voters at the Annual IndiaFest Festival at the Minnesota State Capitol grounds in St. Paul.

Edina High School senior Anoushka Jha and her sister Aditi Jha, a sophomore, regularly participate in voter registration drives at naturalization ceremonies and community events. "I have been volunteering for a while, and am excited to vote when I'm 18," said Anoushka. "While the nation's focus is on the presidential election, I believe that local elections are equally important."

Anoushka and Aditi credit their parents Drs. Vaishali and Gautam Jha, preminent physicians and distinguished members of the community for their support.

"We talk about politics frequently and often have spirited discussions about current issues," said Aditi, who wants to be a lawyer and is very interested in public policy. She continued, "My parents support my passion for policy and regularly take time off from their busy schedule to support me."

"We are happy to join local student-leaders in enlisting citizens to register and vote," said Gopal Khanna, former National Vice President of the Association of Indians in America (AIA) who is currently chairing AIA's national initiative on civic responsibility and community service. stations," said Khanna. "Precinct and caucus in every state need polling judges. People can call their city council and sign up to be an election judge. 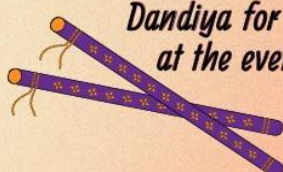

Global Vikas Trust (GVT) is a not-for-profit organization with a mission to transform India by increasing farmers' income. GVT was established in 2016 with a specific focus on the rural economy, environment and 360° development of our farmers & their families. In the past few years, GVT has been able to empower **25,900+ farmers** in **4,600+ villages** from **27 districts in Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh and Gujarat**. This has been possible by creating a movement of farmers to change their cropping patterns, enhance their knowledge by adding the latest technologies of modern farming as well as working on innovative marketing processes to increase their annual incomes from Rs. 10,000 - 40,000 to over **1 lakh Rs. per acre**. So far we have planted **5.5 crore+ fruit trees** that have helped in **multiplying farmers' income** as well as bringing **environmental benefits and sustainability**.

We began this journey by choosing drought susceptible, poverty-ridden, and suicide-prone villages of Parli taluka in Beed district in the Marathwada region of Maharashtra, as we felt that if we could transform the worst area in the country, then we could do it across the country.

GVT started addressing these issues by a comprehensive intervention at 4 levels - water, soil, cropping patterns and farming practices. Our solution takes progressive measures to ensure:

- Effective and efficient water management practices
- Adoption of remunerative crops over traditional crops
- Adoption of best farming practices to ensure proper cultivation
- Soil quality management by way of using organic materials. Increasing carbon content through sequestration.

With 1,000's of farmers benefiting from increased income, we are in a position to encourage and inspire millions of farmers across the country to join this rapid rural economic development movement.

We have undertaken work in the following fields of operations :

Forward linkages: We currently intend to promote the development of forward-linkage units, procurement centres, sort-pack-clean units, farm-to-consumer marketing, cold storage, processing units and post-harvest management.

Replication: We are replicating the model across India. In addition to Maharashtra, we have done plantations in the states of Madhya Pradesh and Gujrat, and talks have been initiated for fruit plantations in other states too.

Institutionalization: We aim to work in collaboration with governments and international organizations to guide the creation of policies and reforms. An international standard, centre of excellence is being constructed. This is part of a hub-and-spoke model of training farmers.

Our end goal is to transform India with scale, speed, focus and impact.

Background to Transform India

(Through a thoughtful, constructive people's movement to transform India, with scale, speed and focus)

Preamble

Farming across the nation had become unviable and rural poverty and unrest were increasing along with migration. Increasing viability will reduce unemployment, reduce migration and retain the youth in farming to use the new progressive policies to bring in fresh energy and vitality.

India has always been able to change through movements and will change in future as well — the independence movement, the movement against the emergency, Mandir, Mandal and the recent Anna movement to cite some examples. However, all of these were destructive or confrontational movements that knew "how to break a building, but did not have a cohesive plan to make a new one"

India needs a movement that is developmental, a movement that has positive outcomes, in short, a *Zindabad* movement.

Plan

A plan was made to create a replicable 'proof of concept' movement of farmers to increase their annual incomes to over 1 lakh/acre. (Typically, annual farmers' income across the country is Rs. 10,000 to 40,000 per acre).

This model must then be replicated and scaled up to cover the nation. That can happen to an extent by our efforts. It must snowball through sustained government interventions and institutionalization.

Some relevant facts:

- a) There are 6.43 lakh villages in India
- b) 68.8 % of people stay in Rural India
- c) Rural poverty is 25.7% with poverty levels @Rs. 32 per day

A. Proof of Concept

- a) We selected probably the worst poverty-affected area in the country (Taluka Parli, Dist Beed, Marathwada, Maharashtra) where there were regular droughts. It had the dubious

distinction of a high farmer suicide rate and "People were living because they were not dead."

- b) We formed a trust called Global Vikas Trust in 2016 to take up various nation-building missions.
- c) The first year was spent supplying water through tankers and doing 360-degree development in 15 villages (education, livelihood, water management, healthcare, skill development, capacity building, social reforms, gram swaraj etc).
- d) It was in 2018 that we really embarked on the mission to transform Indian villages. People participation, scale (multiplying incomes and geographical spread) and speed are our working hallmarks.
- e) Water harvesting and conservation is the fountainhead for any agricultural endeavour. Once the fountainhead is established, all agricultural activity will flourish. This logically leads to maximizing income from land. Horticulture is the answer. In 2018, we created 222 crore litres of water storage — 70 km of deepening and widening of the river and its tributaries, 164 farm ponds, 62 check dams, 5 KT weirs etc. All of this was accomplished through machine work and 'shramdaan' — the voluntary physical labour of thousands of villagers. It brought credibility and support to all the stakeholders and converted into a people's movement.
- f) In 2019, we motivated the farmers to change their cropping patterns and convert part of their farms to fruit plantations. A total of 11.87 lakh fruit trees were planted by farmers including mango, papaya, drumsticks, lemon, guava, custard apple etc.
- g) Armed with a powerful technical team, we did a detailed gap analysis and realized that there were four critical interventions that we needed to make to achieve the primary objective of multiplying farmers' income several times over.
 - a. Change cropping patterns to remunerative fruit plantations. Provide the best variety of fruit saplings, resilient, fruitful and best suited to the local agro-climatic condition.
 - b. Marry traditional farming techniques with the most modern know-how and processes to achieve high quality and better-than-US yields.
 - c. Plant in large clusters so that the market converges to our farmers rather than the other way around and wholesalers converge to our farmers to purchase their produce.
 - d. Facilitate forward linkages like innovative marketing, value-added post-harvest processing, input procurement, supply chain etc.
- i) Despite the lockdown due to COVID-19, in 2020, we planted around 19 lakh fruit trees.



B. Replication and scaling up

Post-2019, we have added Palghar district in Maharashtra and some districts of Madhya Pradesh.

C. Institutionalization

To reach even a substantial proportion of villages in the country, we need to involve the government in this mission. We need to work closely with various governments — Central, State and Local, autonomous bodies like Niti Aayog etc. We need to

influence, convince and participate with the policymakers to implement this successful replicable model and increase farmers' income and GDP.

Facts:

1. Only 4.37% of the arable land of India is under fruit plantation.
2. The yield of fruits per hectare in India is 13.03 Ton (US is 23.3 T/ha)
3. If 11% of land (China 13.95% land) goes under fruit plantation in India, then the increased incomes for farmers will increase by 6 lakh crores (@2 lakhs/acre or Rs 5 lakh/acre) per year.
4. This would mean a 3% increase in GDP (GDP for 2018 =Rs 200 lakh crores)

Besides the agricultural income, there can be a tremendous increase in connected industries (mostly MSMEs), Exports, Supply chains etc. For the above, the Global Vikas Trust team has met some of the key decision-makers of the country.

D. Centre of Excellence ("GVT Krisihikul")

An international standard farmer training centre "GVT Krishikul" along with experimental model farms has begun, coming up at Parli Dist. Beed in Maharashtra. This will consist of 20 model farms each of which will have plantations of different varieties of fruits which can increase the incomes of farmers by many times.



Objective: Knowledge dissemination and capacity building to improve rural Indian farmers' know-how and agricultural capabilities

Components:

- Demonstration facilities
- Agricultural Ashram
- Training and extension facilities
- R&D facilities and Lab

Functions:

- Introduction of advanced agro-technology
- Basic agricultural and farm management studies
- Train farmers in advanced agricultural practices
- Provision of continuous guidance and extension
- Conduct applicable agricultural R&D

Next steps for 2025:

- **Identification of New Areas:** Conduct a comprehensive assessment to identify regions with water scarcity and high poverty levels where fruit tree plantations can be established. Focus on areas where traditional crops struggle due to water scarcity but have potential for fruit tree cultivation with proper water management techniques.
- **Expansion of Fruit Tree Plantation Program:** Extend the fruit tree plantation program to additional districts across Maharashtra state. Collaborate with local farmers to introduce fruit tree cultivation, providing them with training, resources, and ongoing support. Emphasize the economic benefits of fruit tree cultivation, highlighting how it can significantly increase farmers' income over time.
- **Sustainable Water Initiatives:** Prioritize the implementation of sustainable water initiatives, notably through the construction of Global River Aquashafths (GRA). These GRA structures effectively recharge aquifers and raise the water table, crucially addressing water scarcity while enhancing water access in rural communities and agricultural sectors. By ensuring dependable water sources for both farming activities and domestic needs, this approach fosters resilience and prosperity among vulnerable populations.
- **GVT Krishikul Farmer Training Institute:** Through the upcoming GVT Krishikul Farmer Training Institute, our goal is to empower farmers with modern agricultural techniques and knowledge. By providing comprehensive training programs, workshops, and access to agricultural experts, we aim to enhance the capabilities and know-how of rural Indian farmers. This initiative will enable farmers to adopt innovative farming practices, increase crop yields, and improve their livelihoods.

The delegation was impressed by its state-of-the-art simulation labs, which feature interactive mannequins representing adult patients, pregnant mothers, pediatric cases, and newborns. Audrey Maroney detailed the comprehensive nursing curriculum and showcased the Jackson & Muriel Lum Nursing Resource Lab, where students train with cutting-edge simulation computers.

AIA-NY Launches Scholarship Fund for QCC

AIA-NY has pledged to support education at QCC by establishing the 'Student Success Scholarship Fund' with an initial donation of \$10,000 (10 scholarships of \$1,000 each). These scholarships will assist students from low-income families enrolled in certificate or associate degree programs, covering tuition, course materials, and essential educational expenses.

AIA-NY's leadership proudly presented the check to QCC President Dr. Christine Mangino, reinforcing their commitment to future cultural collaborations, including the celebration of Holi this spring and Diwali later in the year.

Kimico Mehta's outreach to the community about the importance of voting during the event was also well-received and appreciated.

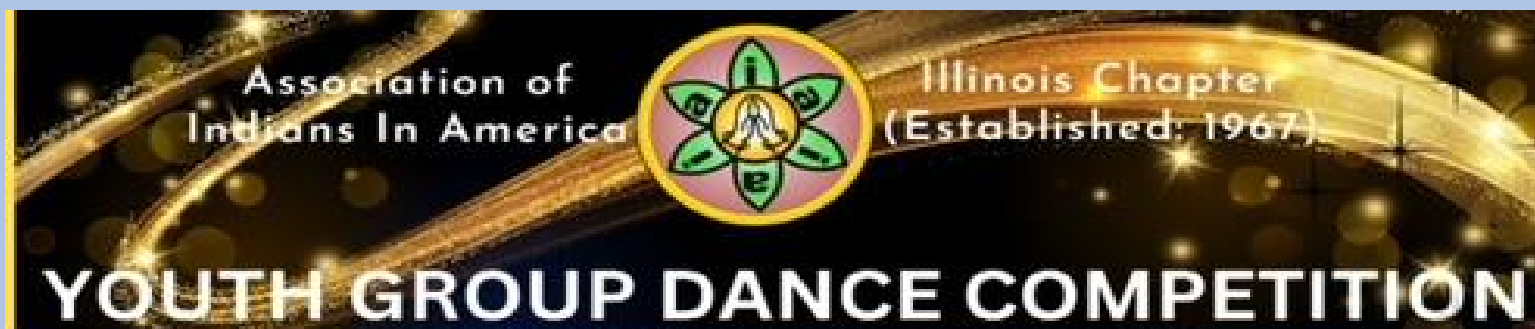

AIA Illinois' Annual Youth Dance Competition A Roaring Success



CHICAGO - For 17 years, the Association of Indians in America (AIA) Illinois Chapter has been at the forefront of promoting cultural unity through its annual youth group dance competition, and the 2024 edition was no exception. Held on September 14, 2024, at the Al Larson Prairie Center for the Arts in Schaumburg, this year's event once again showcased an impressive array of talent, cultural expression, and the unifying power of dance. This year's competition brought together 18 teams, featuring 124 dancers across a variety of traditional, contemporary, and folk styles. The auditorium was filled with the excitement of 350 enthusiastic attendees, whose cheers and applause electrified the atmosphere. The stakes were high, with teams vying for the coveted first-place prize of \$1,000, second place at \$750, and third place at \$500.

As opportunity of heritage and expression, the evening began with an inspiring address by AIA Illinois President Lucy Pandey, who highlighted the importance of providing a platform for youth to express themselves through dance. She emphasized that this competition not only fosters creativity, teamwork and personality development but also serves as a vital connection to the rich Indian heritage. Salil Mishra, Chairman of the AIA Illinois Chapter, and well known community leader, echoed these sentiments in his speech, stressing that the competition is about much more than winning—it is about nurturing teamwork, preserving cultural heritage, and giving young people a sense of community. The dedication behind the scenes was also acknowledged, as Lucy Pandey expressed gratitude to the core organizing team: Santosh Pandey (National Vice President), Nilabh Dubey (Vice President), Shabana Rehman (Youth Dance Coordinator), and Maliha Afreen (Secretary).

The competition featured a prestigious panel of five independent judges, each a respected figure in the world of Indian dance: Shital Dhanani, a renowned Indian dance teacher from the Chicagoland area, Jhara Das, an accomplished Odissi dancer and instructor from Naperville, Guru Vidushi Sindhu M.V. Naik, a Bharatnatyam expert pursuing her PhD in the art form, Prisha Laad, a seasoned choreographer with experience in major Indian TV productions, Dr. Kanak Mishra, a fiction writer and dance critic with deep knowledge of Indian dance traditions. Their expertise added a layer of gravitas to the event, ensuring that every performance was evaluated with the utmost care and cultural insight. The memorable Performances in competition itself was a breathtaking journey through India's diverse dance traditions. Shirlzar, the reigning champions, delivered a power-packed contemporary dance performance that dazzled the judges and audience alike, winning them first place for the second consecutive year. Their innovative choreography and prop utilization left a lasting impression.

Divine Grace, a group of teenage Odissi dancers, took the stage with a mesmerizing interpretation of the Rudrashtakam, a tribute to their heritage and dance form. Their graceful movements and years of disciplined training shone through, earning them the second prize. The third prize went to a group of young women from Nalina Padam, who came together for the first time as a team. Their captivating fusion of music from across India, paired with a symbolic portrayal of war and peace, was lauded by judges for its emotional depth and creative use of lighting.

Other notable performances included:

Atharva Super Dancers, whose puppet and color-lit wing dance featured intricate costume changes and surprising dance concepts
Aan an amateur group of teen friends, who created a high-energy contemporary routine with their own music remix, making it difficult for the judges to choose.

A bold performance by the women of Art in Motion, who used shadow and costume elements to portray an inner struggle, earning praise for their originality

High energy, seamless flow and tons of delicate dance moves by Nritya Vijeta team left a very distinct mark on this years competition.

Avishkar's Lavani team, whose traditional Maharashtrian folk dance brought the house down with its vibrant energy

NK Studio Ladies' Punjabi folk dance, which gave a fresh twist to the competition with its innovative fusion.

Divine Grace raised the importance of one-on-one conversations by use of three generation when interactions are getting limited by all-pervading social media.

Suhani's Ghoomar dance, which transported the audience to Rajasthan with its regal elegance.

In between the intense competition, the future of Indian dance was on full display as young dancers from Atharva Dance School, some as young as toddlers, performed two delightful routines. Their exuberance and coordination brought pure joy to the audience, a heartwarming reminder of the future generation of competition. As the event drew to a close, all the participants gathered on stage, a vibrant display of teamwork, creativity, and cultural pride. Each performance reflected not only technical skill but also a personal interpretation of the themes, underscoring the depth and diversity of Indian dance traditions.

The competition was made possible through generous donations and support from community members and local businesses, including Salil Mishra, Prem Mehrotra, Chris Patel, Vipul Patel, Amit Amin and many others. Felicitations were carried out by Chairman Salil Mishra, President Lucy Pandey, and other distinguished members of the AIA Leadership team. This year's event was a resounding success, leaving attendees inspired and eagerly anticipating the next chapter in this longstanding tradition.

Organized cultural and educational programs of Indian Goddesses in collaboration with Sanskriti Legacy

Two and half years back in August 2022, when I moved to Los Angeles, this idea of starting an AIA chapter in the west coast originated.

I (Santosh khera), past president of AIA started exploring how to go about it. In 2023, AIA supported Sanskriti Legacy in her very well organized cultural and educational program of Indian Goddesses. Most of the trained classical musicians and dancers from different organizations of Los Angeles participated. AIA got the recognition as another nationwide organization.

Then after becoming a member of the very renowned organization Newport Irvine Rotary club, thought of doing a project with them and that's how the idea of starting a Dialysis unit in Kota, Rajasthan originated. I then discussed this idea with Divya shah, my treasurer during my presidency as well as the National President Gobind Munjal and NY chapter President Dr. Jagdish Gupta.

After getting the green signal from all of them, I became instrumental in getting the global grant approved by Rotary International, for starting free dialysis services at KOTA-Rajasthan, in cooperation with Rotary club of KOTA. Process of application started. Past president of Rotary Newport Irvine Mr. Pardaman Singh Sawhney contacted Rotary Kota and helped me go through the process.

It took about a year but now on 1st of December 2024, a Dialysis unit was inaugurated by the minister in a government hospital. Write up on paper and a picture of our plaque is enclosed. Excess funds of \$21,000 which were sitting in AIA NY Chapter were donated for this project.

Now we are planning to start the chapter in April of 2025 by inviting people for picnics and trying to make them AIA members.

Donated \$21,000 to Rotary International to start a Dialysis Center in Kota Rajasthan

कोटा। ऊर्जा मंत्री हीरालाल नागर ने रविवार को रोटरी क्लब द्वारा आयोजित समारोह में 6 किडनी डायलिसिस मशीनों का शुभारंभ किया। ये मशीनें गोबरिया बावड़ी स्थित मानव सेवा समिति चिकित्सालय में स्थापित की जाएंगी। मंत्री ने समाज के सक्षम लोगों से अपील की कि वे अपनी आय का एक हिस्सा समाज में अंतिम पायदान पर खड़े व्यक्ति की सेवा में लगाएं।

समारोह में मंत्री नागर ने रोटरी क्लब के कार्यों की सराहना करते हुए कहा कि पोलियो उन्मूलन के लिए क्लब का वैश्विक अभियान प्रेरणादायक है। उन्होंने क्लब की नई पहल की प्रशंसा करते हुए इसे समाज के लिए अनुकरणीय बताया।

50 लाख की मशीनें और भविष्य की योजनाएं

मंत्री नागर ने बताया कि राजस्थान सरकार वर्ष 2070 तक कार्बन उत्सर्जन को शून्य करने का लक्ष्य लेकर चल रही है। उन्होंने सोलर पावर प्लांट्स को अपनाने और

बिजली की दरों को कम करने की दिशा में किए जा रहे प्रयासों की जानकारी दी। विकलांग सहायता शिविर 11 दिसंबर को रोटरी क्लब कोटा ने 11-12 दिसंबर को दिव्यांगजनों के लिए निशुल्क विकलांग सहायता उपकरण वितरण शिविर आयोजित करने की भी घोषणा की। शिविर में जरूरतमंदों को कृत्रिम पैर, बैसाखियां, व्हीलचेयर, और सुनने की मशीनें वितरित की जाएंगी। इस कार्यक्रम ने समाज सेवा और पर्यावरण संरक्षण के प्रति जागरूकता को बढ़ावा देने का काम किया।
